

SUSPECT PREGNANCY

1. 17 year old senior, steady boyfriend for 1 year, had plans to go away to college, parents are disappointed but supportive; you are covered under parent's insurance, parents make it clear that the financial burden of caring for the child will be yours.
2. Early 20's, living with friend (another girl) in apartment, working full time as a day care worker, boyfriend of 2 months
3. Early 20's, newly separated from husband of 3 years,
4. Late 20's, married 5 years, first child, planned
5. 19, broke up with boyfriend of 1 ½ years, boyfriend's questioning paternity
6. Mid 30's, married 10 years, second child – other child is 4
7. Mid 30's, married 10 years, second child – other child is 7, diagnosed as Down's Syndrome (no other Down's babies are in either family histories)
8. Mid 20's, married 3 years, second pregnancy, first on ended in miscarriage after 4 months, no reason determined for miscarriage
9. Early 30's, married 12 years, 4th child – other children are ages 2, 7, and 11
10. Early 30's, married 15 years, trying to have child for past 10 years. Began adoption procedure when you suspect being pregnant
11. 20, married 6 months, first child, not planned (actually were “planning” to wait 5 years before having children)
12. Mid 20's, planned pregnancy, 1st child. Family has excluded you since your marriage of 3 years to a man from a foreign country
